IRC allows a deduction in the year in which a business starts for start-up expenses. The deduction amounts to the lesser of the amount of start-up expenses OR \$5,000 the remaining of the portion must be AMORTIZED over a 180 month period. The burden of providing the existence of a deduction or loss falls on.

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-Personal casualty losses (in excess of 10 % of AGI and a \$100 floor per casualty) -Certain personal interest expense (e.g., mortgage interest on a personal residence) -Miscellaneous itemized deductions (in excess of 2% of AGI)
